CY was gone from my 2nd period class at the clinic for almost all of the class period. When his On Tuesday, peers returned, he did not. I asked his peers where he was and they said he was still in the clinic talking with Ms. McCormick. When CY finally did arrive in class, with ten minutes or so remaining, I asked him what took so long with the clinic but he didn't really have a clear answer and seemed uneasy about me asking of his whereabouts. Later on, during lunch, I observed Ms. McCormick and CY eating lunch together away from his group. I asked CY why he was not with his group to which he replied that he was talking with Ms. McCormick. I encouraged CY to rejoin his group when he was done talking and emphasized that being with his peers during meal time was part of the program model for supporting peers. I didn't ask Ms. McCormick what was up with CY nor did I try and focus on their conversation however, I am concerned about pulling kids away from their group for one-on-one interactions. The

conversation seemed light hearted and not necessarily focused on program or behavior specific issues. While I am not alleging that Ms. McCormick has done anything that would violate policy, I just didn't feel very comfortable with the interaction that I had observed.
