### Summary Narrative

### Narrative

1. On September 24, 2012, at approximately 2:33 p.m., Idaho State Police Detective Bret Kessinger and I interviewed Kim McCormick about her knowledge of the criminal allegations contained within the Complaint files against the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections (IDJC). The interview took place at the IDJC office located at 954 Jefferson Street in Boise, Idaho. During the interview, McCormick told us the following:

- a. She is a financial technician for IDJC. She has held that position for approximately six years. Prior to working for IDJC, she was employed with the Idaho Department of Corrections as a guard.
- b. She does not have any firsthand knowledge of any criminal allegations contained within the

complaint filed. Everything she knows about the criminal allegations have been told to her by someone else and would be hearsay.

c. She is involved with the lawsuit but her part has to do with what takes place at her work place.

d. She has been to visit the Nampa facility approximately four to six times. The majority of the contact she has with the people at the Nampa facility takes place over the phone handling things like payroll and other financial transactions.

e. She thinks the facility has very lenient practices. During one of her visits, she observed Julie McCormick wearing a tank top and mini skirt.

f. Her most recent visit to the facility was in August of this year for the company picnic where she met the new head of security, Mark Freckleton.

g. There was a time when she would not have believed all of the rumors coming out of the Nampa facility, but because of being harassed at her current position, she now believes all of it.

h. She gets harassed for things like laughing. She has been reprimanded by her supervisor Donna McCray for laughing. She decided to meet with the attorney because of the harassment.

i. She has talked to Director Harrigfeld repeatedly about the harassment. She would call Harrigfeld and ask to meet on the corner of the street outside because of the consequences she would face.

j. She has been told she could be fired for talking to the director.

k. It was rumored that records were being destroyed. After the rumor surfaced, the missing records started reappearing.

l. She knows there have been cases of juveniles and staff being injured and those records disappearing, and then reappearing. She knows of a teacher being very badly injured and those records disappearing.

m. In June, they had a huge records dump which doubled the billing amount paid to the shredding company.

n. When the IDJC requests restitution, Gray Gregston will submit a request. She will give him a restitution number then he will subsequently give to her a report containing all the pertinent information about the damage and parties involved. She will then track the restitution. Not many get paid, or submitted, they simply just keep the requests on file. She doesn't understand why they keep records of it if they are not going to seek the restitution.

o. During her employment within IDJC, she has not seen one restitution request go to court. The juveniles are mostly required to complete work within the facility to pay the restitution.
