Good afternoon. A question was raised to Human Resources last week regarding the hiring of the Choices and Solutions Unit manager position. The question regarded whether or not the chosen candidate, Laura Roters, met the minimum qualification for 'good knowledge of supervision.'

Due to the question, the Human Resource office reviewed all the applications and exams, with a focus on Question 2 which pertained to supervisory knowledge. The review revealed that Laura Roters' application had been scored incorrectly and although she was given a passing grade allowing her to interview and be chosen for the Unit Manager position, her current supervisory experience/education for the supervisory qualification is not sufficient. Laura Roters will remain in her current position with JCCN as the Facility PBS and Training Coordinator. The Choices and Solutions Unit Manager position will be re-announced at a later date.
